## Brazil in the Global Crisis

A former Portuguese colony, Brazil is an emerging economy with a historical democratic and social equality deficit now struggling to overcome past structural obstacles to its full development. Having devoted itself to a long process for the stabilization of its currency, which required a great deal of fiscal responsibility, the global crisis has struck Brazil while the nation was in the process of consolidating recent positive results in social and economic areas, posing new challenges to the future. In this context, spontaneous social movements and street political demonstrations similar to those erupted in other countries have unvailed a more aware and demanding civil society to which the three branches of Power have paid increasing attention. The sustainable development of the country's huge natural resources and specific national expertise in strategic areas have been and will be crucial in facing domestic and foreign challenges, present and yet to come, in which federative solidarity and international multilateralism should be the basis for Brazil's assertion as a generous nation towards its people and a peaceful softpower country in world context.

Prof. José Marcos Domingues is specialist in Public Law, with a focus on public finance law, environmental taxation and public policy. He is a Full Professor of Rio de Janeiro State University and an Associate Professor of Petrópolis Catholic University (Rio de Janeiro). Prof. Domingues has kept close relations with Japan since his experience as a Monbusho research student. He is the founder of the Brazil-Japan Exchange Program of Rio de Janeiro State University and Coordinator of the Program in the area of Social Sciences. Lawyer and a former Rio de Janeiro State Attorney. In 2011 Prof. Domingues was awarded the title of Rio de Janeiro State Benefactor Citizen.

His recent publications include Global crisis, public policy and public finance law: the case of Brazil (2012), and Electric Vehicles, Energy Efficiency, Taxes and Public Policies in Brazil (with Luiz Pecorelli, 2013).
